



## Sexey's School Physical Education PE Kit Policy

Appropriate clothing is essential for the safe participation in physical education and Sexey's School PE kit is students' uniform for their physical education lessons. Below is the PE kit required for the range of activities currently on offer

Students must wear clean, correct PE kit for every lesson **even if they are ill or injured** so they can still take an active part in the lesson. This will enable students to fully partake in the activity when they return to full health, it prevents their school uniform from getting damaged whilst standing on muddy pitches and in cases of illness it prevents conditions from worsening as students still have their dry uniform to get changed into if it is raining during the lesson. There are occasions when this would not be possible and this is at the schools discretion i.e. severe injury or illness but **as physical education is compulsory in school only in exceptional circumstances will alternative arrangements be made for students when they are 'off games'**. Otherwise they will remain with their teaching groups and participate in the role of coach or official for the activity. Should a student be 'off games' they should come to their lesson in their PE kit as normal but also wear a school hoody/waterproof jacket and/or tracksuit bottoms.

Should a student not have their PE kit for lesson, even if they are 'off games' they will be placed in a lunchtime detention. Should a student be missing 3 individual items of kit on 3 separate occasions they will also be placed in detention. Following a student's 3<sup>rd</sup> lunchtime detention every subsequent detention will be an after school detention. Jewellery is not allowed under any circumstances and must be removed for all lessons, therefore, **should students wish to get their ears pierced this should be completed at the start of the summer holidays so earrings can be removed in September**. Covering the earrings in tape is **not** an alternative to the earrings being removed and refusal to do so will be dealt with in accordance with the schools behaviour policy.

Should students require the use of an inhaler they must have it on their person for the lesson and pass it to their teacher while taking part in physical activity.



## Sexey's School Physical Education PE Kit Policy

The aim of the PE policy is to ensure the consistent and safe participation in Physical Education for all students in all lessons.

3 kit marks (k) (missing 1 item of PE kit) Lunchtime DT on SIMS

No PE kit to a lesson (K) (with or without OG slip) Lunchtime DT on SIMS

**4<sup>th</sup> and subsequent detentions are afterschool detentions**

**Refusal to remove earrings is a lunchtime detention and contact must be made with parents/carers**

Students with persistent kit issues to be placed on white PE report with a lunchtime DT on SIMS for any kit issue. Students will remain on report for 5 lessons for KS 3 or 6 lessons for KS 4 and kit must be exemplary during this period. Kit marks are erased in July.

Students without kit should make every effort to bring an alternative PE kit, even if it is not Sexey's kit so that they may still take some part in the lesson.

Should a student have to go onto a 2<sup>nd</sup> report card the sanction will be an after school DT for any kit issue.

Persistent kit issues are defined as multiple individual missing items of kit (6) over a series of lessons or multiple times without kit (3) or any combination of the two resulting in multiple detentions (i.e. 2K + 3k).

Students given a 4 on their effort grade and target progress for organisation/kit will also be placed on report with lunchtime DTs. Students who are increased to a 5 will be placed on report with afterschool DTs.

All reports to be recorded on SIMS and contact made with parents/carers for any student on after school DT report (i.e. 5 on report or on 2<sup>nd</sup> report card).

Any student not responding to afterschool DT report requires support from HOD/HOH and meeting with parents/carers to rectify situation.

While interim reports are a guide to when a student should go on report, the class teacher's discretion is the overriding factor. The threat of a report can also be used as a sanction.

Mitigating factors (SEN, likely to school refuse, etc.) should always be taken into account within reason and lockers are available for those with poor organisational skills.
