Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND) which are provided for at Sexey's School:	<p>The SEND department, known as PLuS (Personalised Learning Space). provides support for young people across the 4 areas of need as laid out in the SEND Code of Practice 2015:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Communication & Interaction- Cognition & Learning- Social, emotional, and mental health difficulties- Sensory and/or physical needs
How Sexey's School identifies and assesses young people with SEND:	<p>Young people with SEND are identified and assessed using:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Referrals from a student themselves, parents/carers, teachers, teaching assistants or pastoral team members.- Information passed on from previous schools- Whole school screening in Year 7 and Year 9- Individual standardised assessments for specific needs- Individual assessments for Exam Access Arrangements (EAAs) at the end of Year 9/start Year 12- Early Help Assessment (EHA) referrals for specialist needs assessments or additional support

How Sexey's School supports young people with SEND:

<p>What facilities Sexey's School has to support young people with SEND:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Differentiated access to curriculum - Functional Skills English and Maths offered in Years 10 and 11 - Use of Assistive technology – PLuS has 5 desktop machines, some students use a laptop or iPad across the curriculum, some students use a reader pen across the curriculum. - Accessible toilet in the humanities building - The humanities building has a lift to enable access to the upper floor. Modern Foreign Languages has easy floor level access to the two main teaching rooms - Lighting adjustments in some classrooms and corridors - High contrast step and street furniture marking
<p>What support is available for improving the social emotional and mental health of young people with SEND?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Appropriately differentiated Personal, Social, Health and Community Education (PSHCE) curriculum delivered in lessons and themed days (this includes RSE). - CAMHS referrals can be made through the school or the student's own GP - Students and/or parents are supported to refer themselves for support from Young Somerset - Pastoral Team - Supported social times at PLuS (break and lunch) - Thrive practitioner - Introduced to self-help apps - Use of calm cards
<p>Arrangements for consulting with young people with SEND:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Students with an EHCP have a named keyworker - Student voice collected and responded to - LSA support - Open door policy to the SEND Team in PLuS. - Assess Plan Do Review (APDR) plans are made with students in receipt of SEND support and Annual Review meetings are held with students who have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) – detailed student views are collected through a pupil passport in advance (for SEN Support) and through Pupil Views for Annual Review (for students with an EHCP).

<p>Arrangements for consulting with parents:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A student's form tutor is the first point of contact for any general concerns. A student's subject teacher is the first point of contact for a subject concern. Contact details are found on the school website. - SENDCO Email: rtaylor@sexkeys.somerset.sch.uk - Telephone: 01749 813393 - Annual APDR meetings with SENDCO for students in receipt of SEND support and students with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) - Students with an EHCP have a named keyworker - EHCP review meetings with SEND Assessing and Reviewing Officer (ARO) from Somerset's SEND Team invited to attend - Progress and engagement grades sent home every reporting period - SENDCO available at Parent Evenings
<p>How we support young people transferring to Sexey's School:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - SENDCO will attend Year 5 and 6 Annual Review meetings for students with an EHCP - SENDCO attends transition review meetings during the summer term as necessary - Enhanced, supported transition sessions for SEND students if required prior to the full Year 6 transition day. - Close liaison with current setting for students transferring to Sexey's Sixth with an EHCP.
<p>How we support young people with SEND transferring to college/Sixth Form:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - SENDCO and head of year attend transition panel meetings from the Summer Term of Year 10. - College Taster days information is shared with students and parents. - Appointments with the Career's advisor - Annual Review meetings with SENDCO for students with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) - Representative from post-16 provider invited to attend Year 11 Annual Review meeting for students with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) - SEND information (including EAA) transferred to Post-16 provider - Referrals made for support from Somerset Works for students at risk of Not being in Education Employment or Training (NEET) - Referrals made for travel training support as required

Results Summer 2022	<p>Summer 2022 Results 6 students in the Year 11 Cohort had identified SEND (4 students with an EHCP) Progress 8 = -0.37 (*provisional based on 2019 data) Attainment 8 = 37.17</p>
What did we do?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - EAA in place for all examinations, mock examinations and in-class assessments - Tailored intervention/ support to specific students who required it - Period 6 targeted booster sessions - Revision booklets and past paper packs - School careers advisor available to support and guide students in advance of and upon receipt of results - Somerset Works and #Focus5 support in place for students who required it
